What is Rotary?

Rotary is a global network of volunteers; businesses, professional and community leaders who provide humanitarian service and encourage high ethical standards. Rotary helps build goodwill and peace in the world.

Rotary is more than 1.2 million men and woman in over 35,000 Rotary Clubs in 200 plus countries and geographical areas around the world. Every Rotarian wears a pin that says "Rotary International". This pin is a passport to new friendships around the world.

Rotary is *The Rotary Foundation* which each year provides some \$90 million for international scholarships, cultural exchanges, and humanitarian projects, large and small, that improve the quality of life for millions of people. It addresses challenges presented by, illiteracy, disease, hunger, poverty, lack of clean water and other environmental concerns. Rotary is widely regarded as the world's largest private provider of international educational scholarships.

Why the name "Rotary"?

Rotary is the world's first service club. Paul Harris, a lawyer and three other men started the Rotary Club of Chicago on February 23, 1905. After the first meeting, the meeting was "rotated" from office to office.
